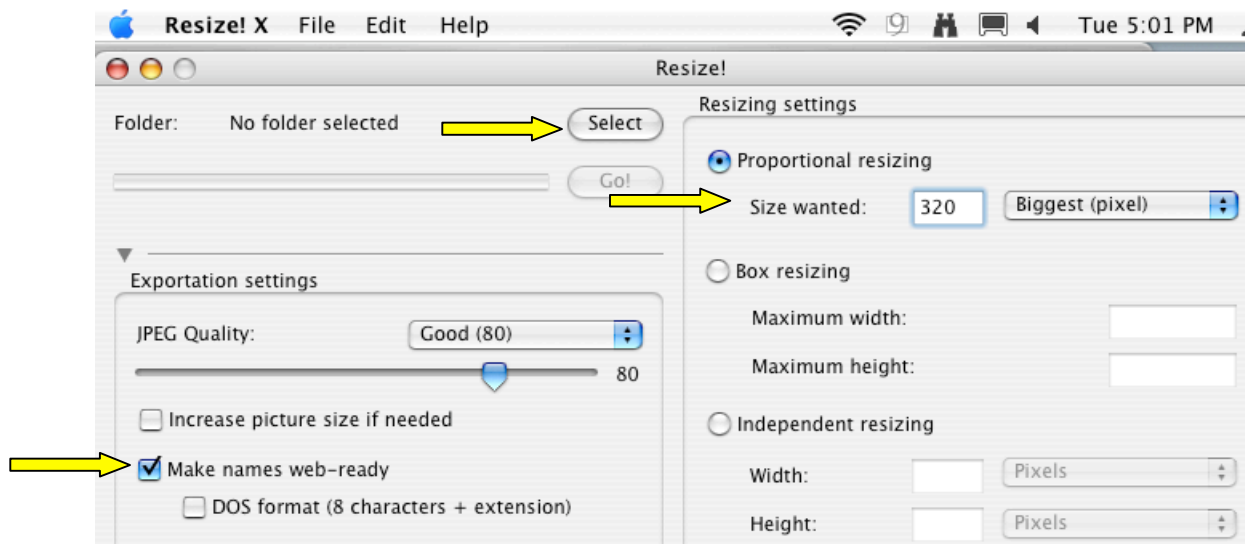
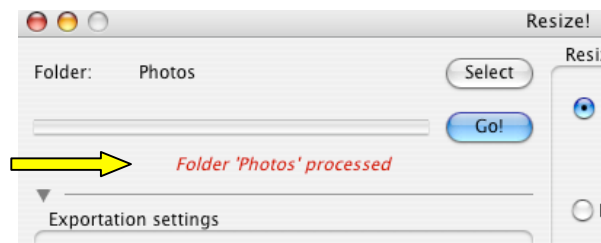


Resizing multiple photos:

1. You will need to start with an empty folder on your desktop. Click on **File** from the menu bar and drag down to **New Folder**.
2. Give the folder a name, in this example I named the folder **Photos**.
3. Most of you will have your photos inside the iPhoto library. You'll need to launch iPhoto and select the photos you want to resize. Make sure your photos are all rotated correctly before copying the photos! To select more than one photo hold down the Apple key and click on all the photos you want to copy. When you've selected the last photo drag the photos to the Photo folder on your desktop. It will tell you exactly how many photos were copied. You are now done with iPhoto so you can quit that application.
4. Launch Resize from your loading dock. You will see the following window.



5. Click on the **Select** button and navigate to select the Photo folder that resides on your desktop. Check to see that you have the appropriate size selected. For web photos we recommend using **320**. This way the photos will launch quickly on computers from home. If these photos are for use on your webpage make sure to click in the box that says **Make names web-ready**. Now click on the **Go!** Button.
6. It will quickly resize your photos and you'll see the following screen.



7. You will end up with two folders on your desktop. One will have a copy of your original photos and the second would be renamed, in this case Photos (B320). You are now ready to insert the photos that reside inside the folder named Photos (B320) into your webpage.
